




Wreath: Many of us adorn our homes with a wreath at Christmas time. A wreath bids us welcome and we may not know the origins of the wreath. My reading led me to understand the background of the wreath. Pagan traditions saw life preserving qualities in the evergreen branches. The giving of evergreen branches with the wish of health and vigor evolved into a circular shape we know as a wreath. This circular shape has come to symbolize perfection and unity. We again see the wreath at the

crucifixion. The pointed holly leaves we correlate to Christmas becomes the thorny crown worn by Christ. The red berries of the holly in the Christmas wreath could symbolize the drops of blood shed by Christ at the Cross. The evergreens at Christmas may remind us of eternal life as promised by Christ.


