

**Images of Advent:** This year as you prepare for Christmas, take time to look upon Advent as an opportunity to prepare your heart and mind to receive the glorious gift of Christ. Each week reflect on one of the symbols that remind us of birth of Christ and God's provision for our ultimate gift of salvation.



## Gifts:

With much anticipation we look forward to Christmas Day. But is it because of the birth of Jesus or do we seek to unwrap those desired gifts under the tree? Gift giving recreates the giving of the gifts from the Magi- the gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. The idea of gift giving goes back to Roman

times long before Christianity. The Romans celebrated Saturnalia with the giving of gifts to celebrate the bounty provided by the agricultural god depicted by Saturn. This took place the end of December with the exchange of gifts and merriment. Emperor Constantine's conversion in AD312 to Christianity began the evolution of this pagan practice of gift giving to take on a Christian perspective when the gift giving was associated with the gifts of the Magi. Nikolaos of Myra, a fourth century saint had a practice of giving gifts and thus he became known as Saint Nicholas. He had a reputation for kindness and generosity. We as Christians have been blessed to have received the greatest gift of all: Our redemption that began even before the birth of Christ. As we exchange gifts this season, let us remember the kindness and blessings we have received.
