Merry Christmas!

Tonight, in worship we celebrate the birth of Christ. We are having one service, at 7pm. I know this is a deviation from our usual in-person Christmas Eve schedule of two services. I've been asked several times why we are only having one. Since Covid has affected our worship attendance, we thought it better suited the celebratory nature of Christmas worship to have one fuller service than two sparsely attended events. This may not be ideal, but at least we are worshiping in person.

As you have probably guessed, I am off this coming week. Garth Stevens-Jennings, our Director of Children's, Youth, and Family Ministries, will be preaching. There is no Sunday School on Sunday, just worship. If you're in town, give Garth some support and be present for his first sermon at CTPC.

What I am looking forward to the most is the break. I'll be honest with you: I'm exhausted. After I return on Monday from visiting my parents, I plan to rest in the nothing of a few days of quiet. There will be nothing to plan, nothing to do until the kids, Laurie, and I gather on New Year's Day to celebrate Christmas together (let me tell you, getting several adult working children together at the same time is a challenging feat!).

2021 has been hard. The pandemic did not end, as we had hoped. In fact, there were times this year when it got downright horrible. And right now, we seem to be in another wave, and it's just so tiring. As pastor of a mid-size church, the safety of the congregation and of the groups who use our building has been on my mind every single day for twenty months, in addition to my own health and that of my family. And while we were dealing with this, the political and social temperature of our nation reached the boiling point on a couple of occasions. Plus, there are the usual pastoral concerns that arise while serving a congregation.

I am glad I know Jesus as Lord and Savior. I don't think I've had a more active prayer life than I've had in the past twenty months. Some days, the prayers are long. Some days, I just say, "Lord, I got nothing. Help." And every time, Christ sustains and proves himself faithful. I honestly have no clue how people with no faith are making it during such a difficult time. I have no idea if 2022 will be better, worse, or more of the same. But what I do know, is that the God who came down at Christmas in the greatest demonstration of love the world has ever known, will not leave or forsake those who trust and follow him. God is faithful, no matter what is happening. And that, dear friends, is the miracle of Christmas.


