

### I often tell the congregation that participation in a committee can be really rewarding experience and a source of spiritual growth. What many people may not realize is that since I am a member of the Shenandoah Presbytery (ministers are not members of congregations), I am encouraged to serve on one of the various committees of the presbytery. For the past few years, I have served on the Committee for New Congregational Development. In our meeting this week, I heard about something unique and exciting: Dog Church. It is a ministry of one of the congregations in Staunton. Once a week, people who love their doggos gather to walk their dogs together. It also serves as a playdate for the dogs. Before they walk the dogs, there is scripture reading, prayer, and often small group discussion. Dog Church attracts people from outside the congregation that hosts the group.

That got me thinking. How hard would it be for the members of our congregation to combine our passions with our faith? I know the prospect of leading a small group may seem daunting, but we can train people to lead such a group. Here are some examples of the kinds of groups we could easily create:

**Dog Church**. See above. We have many dog lovers in our midst. Walking. The name for this group practically writes itself, "Walking by Faith.

**Music.** And even this is a broad category. Classical, country, praise, and so on. Listen to some music together and then have a short Bible reading and prayer time.

**Running**. Like the walking group, but for those insane people who love to run.

**Bicycling.** I'll lead this one, if there is interest.

**Cooking.** We already have a supper group, but I'm sure there are people who would love to cook together!

Stock Market/Investing. This is a hobby for some, and what a great way to learn this hobby from others.

Any passion or hobby can connect to a small group. It is a very creative way we could do outreach. If you are interested in this, please do these two things: First, pray about this. There is a little work involved and it is a commitment. Second, let me know. I will help you develop the skills and format that suits your group. We can also work together on how to spread the word.

For those who think this is a great idea but can't think of how they might do this, please be in prayer for those who will take this step of faith.

Remember, our mission as Christians and as a congregation is to make disciples. Combining this mission with one of our passions is great and fun way to help people outside of the faith connect with other Christians in a relaxed environment that can give them a safe place to share their questions, all while engaging in a shared passion.



donations and nominal fee Paypal service, we set up online giving through the Presbyterian Foundation. Money donated via any of these services gets deposited to our church bank account. By going through the Foundation, the fee they charge actually helps the mission of their organization, which is to help Presbyterian churches to be excellent stewards of their gifts and resources. The exciting part about working with the foundation is that we are able to use a mobile app that is connected to our account. The app is called Vanco Mobile Faith Engagement on the Google Play or Apple App Store. You can set up for weekly, monthly or one time giving! Note: If you were previously using the "Give Plus" app, that has been superseded by the Vanco Mobile Faith Engagement as of January 31, 2022.
