Session News

At the February 15 stated meeting of the session, the elders took the following actions:

- Examined David Weil for participation as an "Explorer" in Shenandoah Presbytery's Commission Ruling Elder program. This is the first step in David determining if he wishes to be a CRE. When David completes the program, he will be able to provide pastoral services to congregations in the presbytery. David received enthusiastic and unanimous endorsement from the session. Marsha Dibbern agreed to serve as David's session liaison.
- Approved a request submitted directly to the session by the group Charles Town Light House Aglow, to host a conference on domestic violence at the church on May 21, 2022.
- Approved a revised description of the treasurer responsibilities submitted by the trustees and finance committee. These duties include attending quarterly Joint Finance Team Meetings, checking in with bookkeeper at least quarterly to ensure all procedures are being followed, presenting quarterly reports to the Joint Finance Team, and ensuring the annual financial review is completed and the report presented to Session. The session is seeking someone from the congregation to serve as treasurer. This person should be versed in financial practice and can commit to the tasks outlined above. Interested person are welcome to contact the chair of the finance committee, Kathy Donadio, at feebler8@gmail.com.
- Unanimously approved a request from the worship committee to remove the small front pew on the downtown side of the sanctuary to make room for a permanent bell table set up. This will reduce moving of tables and bells. For concerts and special occasions, the bells will still be able to set up across the front of the sanctuary.
- Appointed Kathy Shue as elder commissioner for the February meeting of Shenandoah Presbytery.
- By majority vote, the elders revised the pandemic policy. Beginning March 1, masks will be optional for all activities. The session asks all members and attendees to be mindful of others, and to consider staying home when not feeling well, whether it is the flu, covid, or some other illness
- By unanimous vote, approved a contract for roof repairs to the manse and replacement of the fellowship hall roof. More information will be shared with the congregation under separate cover.

Dear Church Family,

At the February 15 stated meeting of the session, the elders approved a roofing proposal with two parts — repairs to leaking areas along the chimneys of the manse, and replacement of the fellowship hall roof. Anyone who has recently visited the fellowship hall can spot the water damage, particularly along the parking lot wall. The fellowship hall roof is the oldest of our metal roofs and is over thirty years old. Replacement is the best option. The manse problem is intermittent —precipitation has to be heavy, and coming from a particular direction. It is not a new problem; we have had to deal with repeatedly for over twenty years. Essentially, the section along the chimneys was installed incorrectly, and these repairs will correct that issue. The estimate for both projects is \$58,106. When the roof is replaced in the fellowship hall, there will be additional expenses to repair the damage from the roof leakage.

This is obviously an unplanned expense. The session is considering how to finance this project, and it is possible a capital campaign may follow. Members and friends of the congregation are invited to give a financial gifts to help offset the costs of this unexpected repair. Those who are able are asked to make sure "roof repairs" is in the memo of the check. As one of the elders astutely observed during the meeting, "The roof is the most important part of any structure." The session also asks the congregation to keep this matter in prayer.
