The season of Lent is upon us. Like Advent, Lent is a season of preparation, and it is two weeks longer. What I appreciate about Lent is that the emotional anxiety most of us experience in December is largely absent. This is because most of us have a deep emotional connection to Christmas. There is a greater emphasis on family gathering, we all have memories of Christmas, some joyous, some painful; and let's be honest – there is some pressure to the Christmas season because we give a greater number of gifts to others than at any other time of the year. Lent has none of that.

Because of this, Lent affords us a deliberate opportunity to reflect, repent, and renew, and the space in which to do it. Now that the Covid virus seems to be abating, thankfully, there are some activities we are planning that we could not do for a couple of years. For this, I am both grateful and excited. Three of those activities are happening this weekend. (And yes, I know I keep promoting them, but I'm excited we can finally do these kinds of things!)

**Devotionals**. The worship and music committee has purchased a devotional guide for personal use during the season of Lent. This will come under separate email and will also be included in the church bulletin every Sunday in Lent.
