

MUSINGS...



Throughout my Christian journey, I have routinely come across this word: worldly. What does it mean to be worldly? What is worldliness?

Christians often think of worldliness in terms of behavior. To be worldly is to engage in things that are common in the world – going to the movies... playing cards...drinking alcohol...listening to non-Christian music...hanging around with non-Christians. And on the list goes.

When I got started in youth ministry, I read a book that had this impressive list of traits that began with this question: Which of these traits is something a good Christian engages in? The list included items like, "Zealous student of the scriptures...rigorous and faithful worship attendance..." For most people, all twelve traits in the list seem like good things for Christians. But when the reader turns the page, the author notes that all twelve of these characteristics were traits of the Pharisees.

Worldliness is not about behavior; it is a mindset. To be worldly is to think in terms defined by humans, not God. For example, we live in a world where success is encouraged. That inevitably means that someone wins, and others lose. Do we not think that people with numerous degrees, or someone who runs a large company is more successful than the person who runs a small, profitable business in the same zip code in which they grew up? We are conditioned to measure, and that measuring often finds its way into our spiritual life. We instinctively measure "how we're doing" in our spiritual lives and how well others are or are not. We compare ourselves to one another. That is a worldly way to think about our faith in Christ, and it is something we must stop.

I am not suggesting that we should stop healthy spiritual practices like personal Bible study or corporate worship. Such activities lead to a growing faith. What we must stop is thinking of one another in terms of good or bad; better or worse. It is simply not helpful. Our focus must first be on our own growth in Christ, and then on loving one another. When a brother or sister in Christ is struggling, what they need from us is love and partnership, not a list of what they did wrong.

And when it comes to non-Christians, they too, need our love and patience. We do well to remember that God loves them just as much as he loves us. It is God's job, not ours, to convict them of their sin and lead them to faith.

Worldliness is a mindset. Let's ask God to change our minds!

Tools for a Growing Faith



Be sure to check out the updated bulletin board outside the sanctuary." Be the light" lightening bugs are all over the place!



The exciting part about working with the foundation is that we are able to use a mobile app that is connected to our account. The app is called Vanco Mobile Faith Engagement on the Google Play or Apple App Store. You can set up for weekly, monthly or one time giving!
