

Today's Scripture Reading Ecclesiastes 11:1-10

11 Cast your bread upon the waters, for you will find it after many days.

- 2 Give a portion to seven, or even to eight, for you know not what disaster may happen on earth.
- 3 If the clouds are full of rain,

they empty themselves on the earth,

and if a tree falls to the south or to the north,

in the place where the tree falls, there it will lie.

- 4 He who observes the wind will not sow,

The 2021 plan had only five readings per week, and we were able to finish the entire New Testament. The 2022 plan has two readings every day, and they are a little longer, but we will read through the whole Bible in a year. If you read through the 2021 plan, it is okay to use this plan but skip the New Testament readings. These are the readings from which Pastor John will do his daily devotions each morning on the church Facebook page.
