It's hard to believe this is the last newsletter of 2022!

By all accounts Charles Town Presbyterian Church has had a pretty good year. The usual metrics are pretty good. Weekly worship attendance continues to creep upward. It's not growing by leaps and bounds, but it is moving in a favorable direction. Overall membership is up significantly. We welcomed fifteen new members this year, and there are still some people that would like to join. And then there is everyone's favorite metric, finances. Giving is higher than expected, too.

Just a few weeks ago, we celebrated the congregation's 235th anniversary with a Homecoming Jubilee that was well-attended and great fun. For the first time in years, we had a meal after worship! We got to see some old friends and make new ones. Margaret Kursey and her team put together a wonderful celebration.

On the missions front, we had a great year. We staffed the friendship meal every month, adapting to the high numbers that come to that meal. When inflation is high it is especially dreadful for people who are food insecure. I am so glad this wonderful ministry continues. We also started a new event, the Walk for Water. A number of people participated in this, and we are excited to participate again in 2023! In the fall, we shifted away from Operation Christmas Child to focus more locally, helping two single-parent families have a better Christmas.

Under Garth's leadership the children's ministry continues to grow, and this is critical. Covid all but obliterated our children's program, and he basically had to start from the ground up. It's wonderful to have new children in the church family and we are excited that this ministry shows signs of continued growth.

Earlier in the year, one of our elders, David Weil, was approved by the presbytery to enter the commissioned ruling elder program. And while on the one hand this means that eventually David will be commissioned to lead another congregation, it is also a sign of spiritual growth for us - it is the norm that churches send people to other places to engage in ministry.

Worship saw growth, as well. We added monitors to the sanctuary to aid in worship. And while this addition is not wholly loved by all, this technology is the norm in most churches, and all seminaries now train students to use this tech in worship. Penny welcomed new people into the vocal and bell choirs and has young children singing regularly as part of worship.

As we enter the advent season, we have great cause to be hopeful as a congregation. God is moving, and there is quite a bit going on. Glory be to God!

#### **Christmas Mission Project**

For 2022, the Mission and Outreach committee decided to shift direction with our Christmas mission project. For decades, we have participated with the Shoebox ministry run by Samaritan's Purse. Support for that has waned over recent years, so the committee decided to take a break and do nothing different.

For 2022, the committee has decided to help two families headed by single parents. One family has three children, the other two. Both families struggle to make ends meet, and they have a particularly challenging time at the holidays. Additionally, both parents have had medical issues, making it hard for them to work consistently and provide for their children as they would like.

We are going to raise money for both families, and give them gift cards to stores the parents would like to shop at. Last year, we did all the shopping for one family that had an emergency need. And while that is fun for us, giving the parents gift cards empowers the parents to have more control over the situation. Plus, they know their children better than we do. They get to shop for their children, which is an immense joy for many parents. In addition to the gift cards, we'd like to give each family Christmas-themed gift baskets with small gifts that will brighten their Christmas. My family will be contributing wrapping paper for both families, so we don't end up giving them forty rolls of wrapping paper. We want to give them things that might go into stockings, or make the season more fun – candy canes, small chocolates, hot chocolate mix, etc. You get the idea.

The goal for this project is ambitious: \$2000, which we will split between the families. That may seem like a lot of money, but many of us spend far more than that on just our own household at Christmas. The baskets are in the sanctuary. Checks for this project should be marked "Christmas Mission" in the memo.

What I love about this year's project is that it is local. We are making an impact on people in our community. It builds relationships and demonstrates the love of Christ in a practical way that will bless people in big ways.

#### **Session News**

At the November stated meeting of the session, the elders took the following actions:

- Sustained the examinations of elder-elect Doyle Criswell and deacon-elect Sue Flanagan. Ordination and installation will be held as part of worship on Sunday, January 8.
- Received the minutes of the October 20 stated meeting as presented.
- Heard a verbal report from the Discipleship and Family Ministries committee focused on all the upcoming events. Of note was the consensus among the session that most closets and classrooms throughout the building need a thorough cleaning out and an up-to-date inventory of supplies and equipment.
- Heard a report from the pastor on the stated meeting of presbyter held earlier in the day.
- Authorized the baptisms of Jeremiah, Cora, and Wesley Clark, children of Chris and Sherry Clark, at a date to be determined later.
- Upon recommendation of the trustees, authorized changing the name of the "Charles Town Housing Fund" held with the Shenandoah Presbytery Corporation, to "Charles Town Presbyterian Church Bethard Housing Fund," and assigned two new signatories. As part of the pastors' terms of call in Shenandoah Presbytery, ministers living in a manse are provided an annual amount to be invested to make up for the lack of equity that comes from living in a manse. The presbytery requires that such investments include the pastor's name so there is no question what the fund is for. This change puts us in compliance with that policy.

In this moment I'd like to tell you to expect some great music from our team for the Advent and Christmas season!


In this moment I'd like to announce that our Silver Bells ringing group for the retired and older crowd will be starting back up in January! More details later.
