Over the last few weeks, a unique event captured the attention of many people and was highlighted by many news outlets. Asbury University, a small Christian college in Wilmore, KY, held a typical chapel service on Wednesday, February 8 that unexpectedly blossomed into a twenty-four hour a day prayer and worship service that ended on Monday, February 20. The service was open to the public, and people from all over the United States and some people from other countries made the trek to Asbury to be part of what some were calling a "revival." The sheer volume of people led to a line to wait to get into the service. The reports coming out of this event tell of people publicly repenting, coming to faith in Christ, and engaging in prayer for one another. Countless moments of spontaneous worship erupted throughout the duration of the event.

The most exciting part of this is that none of it was planned. It just happened. This is how the Holy Spirit works. We cannot orchestrate renewal or revival, for we are not the Holy Spirit. We can desire it, hope for it, even try to plan services around it, but we can never make it happen. That alone belongs to the Holy Spirit.

Whether or not the events of Asbury University lit a fire in our nation are still unknown. There are reports of spontaneous prayer gatherings in other parts of our country. Perhaps this is the beginning of something exciting for the American Church, but only time will tell. For now, we must wait and see.

But there is something we can and will do: pray. Before the Asbury Renewal was even happening, I had an idea for something simple to add to our Sunday mornings – informal prayer between Sunday School and worship. I was praying about this for some time and then as news reports started coming in, I got the clear sense from the Holy Spirit that indeed, this was something we can and should do. Will it lead to renewal or revival? That's always possible, but that's not for us to decide. The point is to pray, particularly for morning worship. To that end, I'd like to invite anyone who is interested to join me in the church library on Sundays at about 10:10. We will pray for the upcoming worship service, every part of it, and for all who will be present. We will wrap up at 10:25 and then head into worship.

Perhaps this will lead to something amazing for us, but that does not necessarily mean something akin to what happened at Asbury University. We will be in prayer for one another, and that alone is enough of a reason to do this.



The session met for its February stated meeting on Tuesday, February 21, and took the following actions:

- Received as presented, the minutes from the January 2022 stated meeting.
- By unanimous vote, approved a motion to allow the Discipleship and Family Ministries Committee to begin searching for an additional nursery attendant to work Sunday mornings 10am-noon. It is church policy to have two adults present for ministries working with minor children. In the past we have attempted to supplement the nursery with adult volunteers, but when people drop off the list or cannot serve the Sunday they are assigned, it makes staffing the nursery challenging. This action begins the process of rectifying this situation and making the nursery as secure as possible and in compliance with church policy. Until that person is hired, we will supplement the nursery with volunteers.
- Authorized observance of the Lord's Supper for the next quarter on the following dates, March 5, April 2, April 6 (Maundy Thursday), May 7.
- Approved a wedding request for Sara Fowler and Tanner Elliot, to be celebrated Saturday, October 7.
- Adjourned the meeting with prayer for the needs of the congregation.
