I have a confession. This is my favorite time of the year.

No, not spring, though spring has many things for which I am thankful: the colors, the warmer weather, the life bursting forth. It's incredible! What I am referring to is the time between Easter and advent.

The rhythm of church life is that every church staff starts thinking about advent and Christmas in October. And almost immediately after Christmas, we must think about Lent and Easter. For five or six months we are the busiest we are all year. Christmas and Easter are important times every year, and it is very important to mark those celebrations. They are signposts on our journey with Christ. They are also phenomenally busy. More meetings, more services, more ministry. And if we are not careful, we can easily burn out, and those very celebrations lose their joy.

This is why the time between Easter and advent is my favorite time of the year. There is less "noise," less extraneous stuff distracting us. It allows me to work on being more consistent in almost every area of my life. I like to think of it, believe it or not, as "maintenance season." I have the time to address areas of my life that need work. When we are super busy, we might skip cleaning the house for one week, or wait a few days to mow the lawn. Those things can wait, but not forever. Maintenance is important, for good maintenance will often serve as the foundation for good results in other areas of life.

While we are in this maintenance season, we have the time as individuals and as a congregation to address the areas we may have let go of in the busyness of the past few months. If prayer or scripture reading are not habits, this is a good time to correct that oversight. If weekly worship is not on the calendar, now is a great time to make that change. If there are issues in the way we are administrating the mission of the congregation, this is the season to address it.

My hope and prayer for all this spring, summer, and fall, is that we use our time wisely to make appropriate changes and adjustments that will yield rich rewards in our spiritual life. I close with these words from the Apostle Paul to Timothy, in 1 Timothy 4:8:

"...for while bodily training is of some value, godliness is of value in every way, as it holds promise for the present life and also for the life to come."

Session News

The session met for its February stated meeting on Tuesday, March 21, and took the following actions:

- Received as corrected, the minutes from the March 2022 stated meeting and the called meeting of March 26.
- The CNC have a report to the session and asked for a called meeting to present their report. The meeting is set for Sunday, May 7 immediately following worship. The CNC will recommend the congregation change the number of trustees from five to three. This is because we no longer need as many trustees for the Edge Hill Cemetery board. The CNC will then present their list of nominees for elders, deacons, trustee, and next year's CNC at-large members. That list can be found in the bulletin and newsletter.
- The DFM committee shared that Vacation Bible School will be held July 17-20, in the mornings like last year. The committee also reported on the egg hunt and bowling.
- The session authorized Kathy Shue to serve as the elder commissioner for the May meeting of Shenandoah Presbytery.
- The session scheduled homebound communion for May 7.
- The session authorized a request from Beulah Chapel, for a ramp to be built at the entrance. The work will be completed by Matt Wilfong, a fully licensed and insured local contractor.
