# **MUSINGS...**

In May we celebrated Pentecost, and that kicked off my latest sermon series, "How to ACT like Jesus," which is based on the book of Acts. I'm using the word, "ACT" as a tie-in to Acts; I don't mean that we should pretend to be like Jesus. We should be like Jesus. Over ten years ago I preached through Acts with an eye to what it means to be the Church. This time through, we are focusing on what it means to have an authentic faith.

As parents, one of the most important things we can do is to mean what we say and follow through on our commitments. If children start observing inconsistencies in their parents, trust will diminish, and parenting is less effective. The same is true in just about any sphere of lifework, community, and especially faith.

Right now, the Church in America is at a turning point. Churches are losing members at an unbelievable rate, and Christians are in a real danger of becoming a minority in a very short time. Part of this is on us. We've let politics, racial inequality issues, and culture wars shape our faith. We behave pious and godly on Sundays, and the rest of the time there isn't all that much about us that people can call, "Christian."

That has turned off many people both inside and outside of the faith. It has made evangelism harder. When we behave in a way that is inconsistent with Jesus, people wonder what difference our faith makes. They wonder if we are authentic about what we believe.

What the world needs is authentic disciples of Christ seeking to live for Christ as consistently as possible. They need to see Jesus in us. All the politics, the culture war issues, and other distractions should be screened through our faith, rather than shape our faith. Every generation of Christians has had to live in a world that is decidedly not Christian. Changing the world without changing people's hearts will never yield what we hope for. Only faithfulness to Christ will do that.

It begins with us, we who profess faith in Christ. We must circle back to what is most important in our faith, and the early Christians in the book of Acts give us great examples of what an authentic faith looks like. My hope and prayer as we go through this series and study this book, is that we will emerge more deeply devoted to Christ, that we may show the world what the grace and love of Jesus truly looks like.



He's my friend.


2 Jesus is all the world to me,




