₹ I My nineteenth anniversary as pastor of Charles Town Presbyterian is August 1. It's hard to believe I've been here almost twenty years. It feels much shorter than that. One of the things I like to do this time every year is look back at what's happened over that time, not to toot my own horn, but as a way of remembering what we've accomplished in light of what we still need to do. Most of all, it is to give thanks for the way God has worked in these past two decades. Here are a few examples:

I started at CTPC after an unusually long interim period. A long interim is demoralizing, so one of the first things we did was form a team to think about our core values and mission statement. That work was a way of remembering who we are and what defines us. Those core values are still our core values today, and our mission statement remains unchanged.

Missions has been a huge work for us. In nineteen years, we've had four mission trips, and increased our partnerships with missionaries from one missionary to three. And two of those missionaries visit us regularly, which is wonderful! We were instrumental in addressing the issue of homelessness in our community, and we are part of the regular rotation of churches helping to feed food-insecure people. For the past few years, we've done outreach during the annual Christmas parade. In 2022 we started participating in World Vision's Walk for Water. As the kids say, "Mission is fire!"

We've had some exciting financial moments during the same time. We completed three successful capital campaigns that allowed us to hire staff and make significant improvements to the physical plant. Two years ago, we received a massive gift that none of us was expecting. And though we still function with an annual deficit like most churches, our giving increases annually. All of this is a testament to our congregation's faithfulness. One of the most exciting things we learned about our congregation came out of the pandemic. We learned we are much more resilient than we ever realized. While most churches experienced dips in giving and ministry came to a standstill, we saw an *increase* in giving. Our help to the community went uninterrupted. At the end of the pandemic, we saw the largest number of new members join the congregation in over a decade.


None of this means we can rest on our laurels. Our church is aging quickly. We have fewer young families than I would like. Nationwide, church attendance is trending downward, and ministry and outreach are harder than ever. So, we have our work cut out for us.

We've come a long way, and the Lord has allowed us to accomplish so much. But there is much more still to work on.

Verse 2—How often, making music, we have a new dimension in the world of sound, as worship moved us to a more profound Alleluia!


This verse sings of our choir!, from practice on Wednesday evening to worship on Sunday morning!
