The season of Lent is upon us! Ash Wednesday is this coming Wednesday, March 5, and the season of Lent starts the next day. Not all Christian traditions celebrate Lent, so every year, I remind the congregation of Lent's origins.

The early church had a practice centered around didache, which was a year-long class that was essentially for new members. They would cover the scriptures and theology essential for understanding the gospel. For forty days from holy week (not counting Sundays), the catechumens, as they were called, would fast until Palm Sunday. On Palm Sunday they would profess their faith in Christ, and on Resurrection Sunday, they were baptized and welcomed into the Church.

Several things came from this practice. Confirmation, catechesis, the idea of a church curriculum. The most well-known part of that is the fast, from which we have derived the idea of giving something up for the season.

This year, Ash Wednesday and Lent will be a little different at CTPC. We will not have any kind of formal Ash Wednesday worship. Since the pandemic, this service has struggled, despite our efforts to try different worship experiences to boost attendance. This year, at least, we are taking a break.

The season of Lent affords us a unique opportunity. It really is quite the journey this year, starting during the waning days of winter and concluding in the spring. We will literally go from cold to warm(er). More important is what could happen to us spiritually. Yes, it may be in order to give something up. We all have unhealthy habits that we do well to change. Lent gives us the chance to give those things up with God's help. We can also add a practice during Lent. Fasting one day a week, adding extra prayer time, reading a special devotional. I remember some years I would go to the same park every week for private prayer time. In addition to some great prayer, I also watched the park come to life in early spring. It was powerful!

I encourage everyone to spend some time in prayer in the days ahead. Ask God to reveal what needs work, what would be spiritually helpful. And then on Wednesday, begin the journey that delivers us from death to the light and life of God's promises in Christ Jesus in his resurrection!

Fred McFeely Rogers (March 20, 1928 – February 27, 2003), better known as Mister Rogers, was an American television host, author, producer, and Presbyterian minister. He was the creator, showrunner, and host of the preschool television series *Mister Rogers' Neighborhood*, which ran from 1968 to 2001. Born in Latrobe, Pennsylvania, Rogers earned a bachelor's degree in music from Rollins College in 1951. He began his television career at NBC in New York City, returning to Pittsburgh in 1953 to work for children's programming at NET (later PBS) television station WQED. He graduated from Pittsburgh Theological Seminary with a bachelor's degree in divinity in 1962 and became a Presbyterian minister in 1963. He attended the University of Pittsburgh's Graduate School of Child Development, where he began his thirty-year collaboration with child psychologist Margaret McFarland. He also helped develop the children's shows *The Children's Corner* (1955) for WQED in Pittsburgh and *Misterogers* (1963) in Canada for the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation. In 1968, he returned to Pittsburgh and adapted the format of his Canadian series to create *Mister Rog*ers' Neighborhood. It ran for 33 years and was critically acclaimed for focusing on children's emotional and physical concerns, such as death, sibling rivalry, school enrollment, and divorce. Rogers died of stomach cancer in 2003, aged 74. His work in children's television has been widely lauded, and he received more than forty honorary degrees and several awards, including a Lifetime Achievement Emmy in 1997 and the Presidential Medal of Freedom in 2002. He was inducted into the Television Hall of Fame in 1999. Rogers influenced many writers and producers of children's television shows, and his broadcasts provided comfort during tragic events, even after his death.

We need more neighbors like Mr. Rogers to be a positive influence in our lives!


